Meetings/Community Events/Significant Incidents

- 12/5 & 6/18 – WPFDR assisted with the Christmas Boat Rides at Spring Valley Park.
- 12/8/18 – WPFDR conducted Santa Parade through Village.
- 12/10/18 – The 512 Replacement Committee conducted a web conference meeting with Toyne to review the specifications for the new 512.
- 12/12/18 – WPFDR assisted with a traffic detail on NC 22 Highway for a fallen soldier procession from the airport to funeral home.
- 12/14/18 – FRC met with the architect to review the renovation/addition plans for the purpose of updating the plans to re-bid the project.

## One Person Dies After Being Burned In Sunday House Fire

Multiple fire units were called to a house fire outside of Carthage Sunday afternoon that resulted in one person being seriously burned.

Emergency responders were dispatched just after 4:30 PM to a house in the 600 block of Brinkley Road for a reported structure fire.

The first arriving fire unit to reach the location reported a house heavily involved in flames with one person who was injured.

A lifelight helicopter had been called to transport the adult male victim to a Trauma Center however one was not available, so the victim was transported by ambulance to Firsthealth Moore Regional Hospital. According to officials the elderly man was reported to be deceased shortly after his arrival at the hospital. His identification has not been released pending notification of all family members.

Brinkley Road was closed to traffic in both directions for an extended period of time while firefighters worked to extinguish the blaze which continues as of this report.



Responding to this incident were units with Carthage Fire & Rescue, Eastwood Fire Department, Pinehurst Fire Department, Whispering Pines Fire & Rescue, West End Fire & Rescue, Seven Lakes Fire & Rescue, Moore County EMS, Moore County Fire Marshals Office, and the Moore County Sheriff's Department.
