Meetings/Community Events/Significant Incidents

- 9/6/18 – FRC Lambdin and Chief Cameron (Southern Pines) met with the County Manager to discuss the new fire district boundaries that will become effective with the opening of the new Southern Pines fire station on Highway 22.
- 9/8/18 – WPFRD personnel (7) participated in the 9/11 Memorial Stair Climb in Charlotte.
- 9/9/18 – WPFRD personnel (4) attended a 9/11 Remembrance Service at the New Home Baptist Church in Vass.
- 9/11/18 – WPFRD personnel (5) attended the 9/11 Memorial Ceremony at the Southern Pines Fire Department.
- 9/13 -17/18 – Responded to a total of 59 calls during Hurricane Florence.
- 9/20/18 – FRC attended the Moore County Chief's Association meeting in Carthage.
- 9/25/18 – FRC Lambdin attended the Jerry Osborne bench dedication ceremony at Thunder Bridge.
- 9/30/18 – Working Tractor Trailer & Car Fire on Split Rail Road (Whispering Pines Fire District)
  - FRC Lambdin (1<sup>st</sup> arriving) and five (5) firefighters staffing Engine arrived to find a tractor trailer and a passenger vehicle well involved with fire.
  - 511 crew initiated an attack, knocked down and extinguished fire within 7-10 minutes.
  - Received and utilized mutual aid from Cypress Pointe & Pinehurst FDs to assist with water supply, overhaul, and clean-up.
  - Personnel committed for approximately an hour with overhaul and clean-up.
  - Three (3) additional personnel responded with 512 & 516.

Accomplishments

- Annual pump testing and preventive maintenance was performed on all apparatus.
- Semi-annual fire district sign inspections were completed.
