



From the Desk of Chief Domonic Campbell June Monthly Report for Police Department

Date: July 26, 2018

Special Notes

We collected 5.1 pounds of pills this month.

We conducted interviews for the upcoming officer position opening due to a retirement. An offer was made to Jessica Howard who accepted and will begin in July.

Master Officer John Tate is retiring on September 1, 2018 with 25 years of service with the Whispering Pines Police Department.

We had the equipment trailer wrapped to improve its appearance.



All of our radars were recertified this month.

Events of interest for the month of June 2018

1. There were seventeen (17) incidents that were investigated this month.

- **June 2nd – Identity theft.** A resident of Goldenrod Drive reported that someone was using her debit card information to make fraudulent purchases. Most of the fraudulent purchases were made in Greensboro, NC.
- **June 3rd – Simple worthless check.** As a result of a traffic stop for an expired license plate the officer determined that the driver of the vehicle had an active criminal summons out of Lee County for simple worthless check. The officer obtained the court date to put on the summons and served the summons on the driver. The driver was also given a citation for an expired registration and an inspection violation.
- **June 8th – Simple assault.** A resident of Fairway Drive requested an officer respond to his residence to get his spouse to let him go. When the officer arrived, he found clothing thrown about the front yard and the front door wide open. When the officer started to enter the front door, he saw a woman had a shirt wrapped tightly around her husband's neck. The officer ordered her to let go of him and she did. She stated that her husband had not assaulted her and did not threaten her. The officer observed scratches on the husband's neck. The wife was placed under arrest for simple assault.
- **June 8th – Failure to appear on misdemeanor larceny charge.** The on-duty officer received a call from one of our off-duty officers advising that he observed a female in a vehicle in a parking lot that he knew had an outstanding order for arrest out of Richmond County for failure to appear on a misdemeanor larceny charge. The on-duty officer went to the that location and spoke with the female passenger. The officer confirmed her identity and also confirmed that she did have an active order for arrest. So, the officer placed the female under arrest.
- **June 11th – Criminal summons for failure to return rental property.** An officer observed a vehicle on the side of the road and stopped to see if any assistance was needed. There was no one in the vehicle so the officer ran the vehicle information and determined that the owner of the vehicle had an outstanding criminal summons out of Cumberland County. The officer then found the driver of the car at a nearby residence. The officer served the criminal summons on the driver after contacting the Cumberland County Magistrate's Office to get a court date.
- **June 11th – Voluntary commitment.** An officer was dispatched to a residence on Sunset Drive in reference to a psychiatric call. When the officer arrived, he found a female on the floor with a man laying on top of her holding her down.

- The female was distraught and had been arguing with her family. She wanted to see her psychiatrist but he had not returned her call. EMS checked her out and her sister convinced the female to go to the hospital voluntarily. The officer followed EMS to the hospital in case there was another physical altercation. The female voluntarily went into the emergency room with EMS to be evaluated.
- **June 14th – Failure to appear on a failure to report accident charge.** An officer became aware of an outstanding order for arrest out of Moore County for failure to appear on a failure to report accident charge on a resident of Banning Drive. The resident had minor children so the officer waited until a relative came to pick up the children. After the children were gone, the officer placed the female under arrest.
 - **June 16th – Give malt beverage to person under the age of 21.** A South Lakeshore resident reported that there were 15 – 20 people at a park on Lakeview Drive and the caller believed they were drinking alcohol and maybe smoking marijuana. When officers arrived, they found a total of 18 people in the park and saw beer cans and boxes and several individuals holding beer cans. Two people indicated they were residents of Whispering Pines and the others were there as their guests. There were 2 officers at the scene and they advised all of them to stay at the scene until their investigation was completed. The officers found one individual who started to walk away towards his vehicle. The officer had this person return to the park. While testing and speaking to the individuals the same person again walked away unbeknownst to the officers. Two females later claimed they saw him leaving but said nothing. It was obvious the person was impaired. Then officers heard brakes screeching and the sound of a vehicle collision. One of the officers left the scene to check on this and found a Jeep off the side of the road on Lakeview Drive. There was no one in the Jeep. Then the officer heard people yelling about a man lying in a driveway with severe injuries. The officer and another person who was in the area and said he was medically trained tried to aid the person while the officer advised 911 that EMS was needed and to also notify Air Care. EMS arrived and transported the injured person to the hospital where he died of his injuries. The officers determined that 8 other persons had been drinking and were under the age of 21. They were issued a citation and the officers made sure these individuals had a sober driver to take them home. One individual received a citation for giving a malt beverage to a person under the age of 21. One person was placed under arrest for purchasing the alcohol that was provided to the underage persons.
 - **June 20th – Shoplifting.** An officer was contacted by the Food Lion manager advising that there was a man in the store who was placing merchandise in his pants. When the officer arrived, he could detect that the man had some items in his pants. He asked the man to remove the items, which he did. The manager

indicated that he wanted to press charges and to ban this person from the store. The officer issued the man a citation for concealment of merchandise. The man argued that he couldn't be charged since he hadn't left the store. The officer advised him that he could be charged with concealing merchandise with the intent of stealing. The man was then banned from the store and advised if he returned he would be charged with trespassing.

- **June 21st – Found property.** A woman found a damaged cell phone at the intersection Hardee Lane and Airport Road and turned it in to the police department. The screen was broken but the officer was able to get the cell phone carrier to advise the name of the phone owner. The phone owner lives in West End so the officer had a deputy go by his home to ask him to come pick up his phone. The next day the man came to claim his cell phone.
- **June 23rd – Stalking.** A resident of Cardinal Drive reported that a neighbor keeps coming into her yard and also sending her text messages. She banned the neighbor from her yard and from contacting her anymore in the presence of an officer. The officer advised the neighbor that he could be charged with trespassing if he comes back on her property.
- **June 26th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of Country Club Blvd found a loose dog in her yard. An officer picked up the dog and brought the dog to the dog pen at the police department. A little later another Country Club Blvd resident called to report his dog missing. The officer advised we had the dog. The dog owner came to pick up his dog and the officer issued the dog owner a warning ticket since this was the first violation of the ordinance.
- **June 26th – Failure to appear on a possession of marijuana charge.** An officer ran the license plate of a vehicle and was able to ascertain that the owner of the vehicle had an outstanding order for arrest out of Moore County for failure to appear on a possession of marijuana charge. The officer was able to identify the driver as the person with the outstanding order for arrest so the officer stopped the vehicle. The driver had a child in the vehicle so the officer allowed her to have a relative pick up the child. The officer then placed the driver under arrest.
- **June 28th – Fraud.** A resident of Hammerstone Circle reported that in an attempt to make some extra money she fell victim to a fraud. Money would be deposited into her bank account and then she would receive instructions on how many Apple money cards to buy and she could keep the remaining money in her bank account. She later learned from her bank that she had an overdraft of about \$4,000 on her account because the checks that had been deposited were fraudulent.
- **June 28th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of Harmon Drive reported that she found a stray dog and wanted the police to pick

it up. An officer went and picked up the dog and placed the dog in the kennel at the police department. Moore County Animal Control picked up the dog the following day as an owner for the dog was not located.

- **June 30th – Simple assault.** Officers were dispatched to a residence on New Day Way regarding a physical fight between a mother and an adult daughter. When officers arrived the mother, who owns the house, had advised her daughter that she would not be giving her the residence and they got into a verbal argument. The adult daughter pulled her mother's hair and jerked her head back. The adult daughter admitted to officers that she pulled her mother's hair. There were no obvious signs of injury on either party. Neither party wanted to seek charges. The adult daughter gathered her belongings and left the residence while the officer looked on to ensure there were no more altercations.
- **June 30th – Open container of alcohol.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer observed an open beer can in the middle console of the vehicle. The officer found two more opened and emptied bottles of beer in the rear floorboard area. The officer removed the items from the vehicle and photographed the items. The driver was issued a citation for having an open container of alcohol in the vehicle.

2. There were eight (8) arrests this month with a total of 8 charges.

After an arrest, officers are unavailable for at least 2 hours while processing and booking subjects at the Moore County Jail in Carthage. Serving a criminal summons does not require detaining or taking the subject to jail.

- **June 3rd** – As a result of a traffic stop for an expired registration and inspection violation the officer determined the driver had an active criminal summons out of Lee County for simple worthless check. The officer served the driver with the criminal summons and advised the driver of his court date.
- **June 8th** – As a result of an argument at a residence on Fairway Drive the officer observed a female holding a shirt tightly around her husband's neck and also saw scratches on the husband's neck. The wife was placed under arrest for simple assault and transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **June 8th** – The on-duty officer was advised of the location of a person who had an outstanding order for arrest out of Richmond County for failure to appear on a larceny charge. The officer went to the location and confirmed the female's identity and that the order for arrest was valid. The female was placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **June 11th** – An officer observed a vehicle off to the side of the road and checked out the vehicle registration. The officer determined that the owner of the vehicle had an outstanding criminal summons out of Cumberland County for failure to return rental property. The officer found the driver of the vehicle

working at a nearby residence and served him with the criminal summons after obtaining the court date from the Magistrate's Office.

- **June 14th** – An officer became aware of an active order for arrest out of Moore County for failure to appear in court on a failure to report an accident charge for a Banning Drive resident. The officer went to the residence and found the female home but she had 2 minor children in the home. So, the officer had her arrange for a relative to come pick up the children. After the children were picked up the female was placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **June 16th** – As a result of an investigation about underage drinking at a park on Lakeview Drive, the officers determined that one individual who was 21 years old had purchased the beer and brought several boxes of beer, vodka, and orange juice to the park. This individual stated he was aware that underage persons would be at the park for the gathering when he purchased the alcohol. This individual was placed arrest and charged with giving malt beverages to persons under the age of 21. This individual was transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **June 21st** – The manager of Food Lion requested an officer to come to the store because a man was placing merchandise in his pants. When the officer arrived, he could see that the man had items in his pants. He asked the man to remove the items. The store manager wanted to press charges and ban the man from the store. So, the officer arrested the man by citation for concealment of merchandise and also banned the man from the store. He was told he would be charged with trespassing if he came back to the store.
- **June 26th** – An officer determined that the driver of a vehicle had an outstanding order for arrest out of Moore County for failure to appear in court for a marijuana possession charge. The officer conducted a traffic stop and placed the driver under arrest after allowing a family member to pick up her child. The driver was then transported to the Moore County Jail.

3. There were four (4) traffic accidents in the Village this month.

- **June 5th** – Two vehicles were stopped in the roadway on Airport Road. The first vehicle began to back up to get into a private driveway and the struck vehicle that was behind. There was no damage done to either vehicle and no injuries were reported. The driver of the vehicle that backed up was given a citation for unsafe movement.
- **June 8th** – An accident occurred on Airport Road. A vehicle that was traveling east on Airport Road drove left of the center line and struck the mirror of a vehicle driving in the opposite direction. The driver of the vehicle that was struck turned around and followed the vehicle back to a residence on Shadow Drive. No injuries were reported. There was minor damage to both vehicles.

The driver responsible for the accident was issued a citation for driving left of center.

- **June 16th** – An accident occurred on Lakeview Drive. A vehicle drove way from the park on Lakeview Drive and ran off the right side of the roadway and through a front yard. The vehicle then crossed back across the roadway and went off the left shoulder and went across a driveway, a culvert and a large bush on Dogwood Place. The vehicle then came back onto the roadway and continued down Lakeview Drive and upon reaching a curve in the roadway the vehicle went off the left side of the roadway striking several mailboxes. The driver of the vehicle was ejected from the vehicle. There were no doors on the vehicle and the driver was not wearing a seat belt. The vehicle continued to travel down the roadway until it struck a utility pole. The driver of the vehicle was transported to the hospital but died from his injuries.
- **June 18th** – An accident occurred at the intersection of Country Club Boulevard and Hardee Lane. A vehicle stopped at the stop sign on Country Club and continued forward striking a vehicle that was turning onto Country Club. There were no injuries reported and both vehicles were able to be driven from the scene.

4. Safety (Department)

- All officers participated in assault rifle firearms training on June 28th.

5. Safety (Village)

- Continuous patrol of lakes and parks. Recommended repair be made to floating pier at Thagard park.

6. Other Events of Interest

- **June 13th** – Lt. Dozier attended the monthly Investigators Meeting that was held at the Moore County Sheriff's Office. Topics of common concern are discussed among local law enforcement agencies at these meetings.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Goal #1: To provide a uniform standard that will enable personnel of the department to be more consistent in procedures when handling situations.

Objective #1: Daily briefings are being conducted by officers at shift changes. The Lieutenant and Sergeant have also discussed monthly schedule and operational concerns with all officers this month.

Objective #2: There were no revised policies this month.

Objective #3: All officers completed policy reviews of General Order 001 – Rules of Conduct and General Order 002 – Use of Force.

Goal #2: To provide for education and further development of department personnel to enhance officer and department professionalism.

Objective #1: All officers watched a training video that depicts an officer's encounter with an uncooperative subject. The suspect is fatally shot during the encounter and initial responding officer is injured during the scuffle. The video discusses how every officer needs to train to stay in the fight and never give up.

All police personnel completed the Customer Service training that was required by the Village Manager.

Goal #3: Provide for a higher degree of personal contact between community and department personnel.

Objective #1: There were no community events held this month.

Objective #2: Officers welcomed 21 new residents this month and provided the new residents with a police "Welcome Packet" describing many of the services offered by our department.

Objective #3: There were no requests for Child IDs this month.

Objective #4: No one attended the LEO meeting this month.

Objective #5: There was one (1) request for assistance in installing a child seat this month.

Goal #4: Conduct special enforcement programs and participate in GHSP campaigns.

Objective #1: There were no checkpoints this month.

Goal #5: Continue current crime prevention programs to maintain the Village's low crime statistics.

Objective #1: We remain fully staffed.

Objective #2: A traffic complaint was received in May about speeding on Lakeview Drive. Officers conducted twelve (12) speed surveys in the area. One citation was issued and one warning was issued during these surveys. Officers also conducted a license check on May 31st. Officers will continue to work in this area to enforce the speed limit.

Objective #3: Officers have conducted:

House checks – 668 (average 22 a day)
Business checks – 1,008
Store closings – 46

We added another person to our Senior Call In Program this month. We now have a total of 10 seniors in the Senior Call In Program.

Objective #4: There were no requests for articles this month.

Objective #5: Officers have conducted 66 foot patrols at the Food Lion Shopping Center this month.

Objective #6: No traffic studies were conducted this month.

Objective #7: We have 6 certified child seat technicians. 5 officers and the Sergeant are certified child seat technicians.

Goal #6: Proactive approach in looking for safety concerns.

Objective#1: All officers participated in assault rifle firearms training on June 28th.

Objective #2: Continuous patrol of lakes and parks. Recommended repair be made to floating pier at Thagard park.

Objective #3: In our efforts to meet OSHA requirements, quarterly and yearly reviews of the Infectious Disease Control Plan have been scheduled. A quarterly review was completed by Chief Campbell this month with no changes needing to be made. The next quarterly review is scheduled for September 2018.

Goal #7: Seek a new camera system for vehicle and body worn cameras.

Objective #1: The new in-car camera system and management system has been installed and is working well.

Goal #8: Continue to participate in the Village's ongoing recycling program.

Objective #1: The police department continues to participate in the Village recycling program.
